We know that this might be down to cost, which is understandable, so we thought we would share some print costs with you to show that it might not be as expensive as you think. Bear in mind that this is the cost of a single **standard print** without post & packaging so, printing several images at once will be more cost effective.

the photos on this page.
























### The Show on The Green

## Royal International Air Tattoo



Mike Cullis very kindly sent us his thoughts on the RIAT show for our summer newsletter.

The Royal International Air Tattoo is one of the world's largest military air shows and takes place each year in the RAF base at Fairford.

It's a great day for photography and this has drawn me there on five occasions over the past 12 years. So this year was no exception. I came away feeling that the entry list for both static and air displays was significantly less than previous years, which is a sign of the times. But, the weather was good, which is not always the case - one year in particular I was dressed for the rain. I stood for 3 hrs in torrential rain: not being able to move from my crowd line position in order to hold my tripod-based position amongst the other photography enthusiasts! What we do for a good image!













Here's a selection of images from this year comprising static images taken on my fixed lens Leica. My favourite image for this year is the 'Thunder' aircraft with Pakistani pilot. This is the first time this aircraft has been on show in the UK. The Thunder is a joint venture between Pakistan and China and is a low budget aircraft; costing a third of similar aircraft. Many have seen action around the India/Pakistan border!


My favourite fast military jet has to be the Lockhead Martin F22. Designed in secrecy and said to be the most advanced jet fighter

With both speed and manoeuvrability excellence. The all in cost of an F22 fighter is a whopping \$334 Million. Recently, an upgrade programme was approved at a cost of \$11 Billion. It was rare to see this jet in the UK and the USA are very careful who they sell this to! I was fortunate enough to witness a full flying display. The shear sound, drama and power of this aircraft make other military jets look a poor second!

When the F35 fighter jet was first on display at RIAT, there was a very heavy armed police presence. A sign in front of the static aircraft was signed by the Home Office and stated that 'Lethal Force' was approved should you cross the boundary towards the F35! Another memorable and chilling moment from RIAT!

## Hill Head Photo Walk


