




# Club News - September Photo Walk

On Monday 22nd September we went out to experiment with textures which turned into a light trails experiment. Using a ten second exposure, every shot looks slightly different as you can see below:




# Club News - Waterdrop Photography



I have been several times now and can't recommend it enough. I have included some photos in this article of my time on Skye with my new camera.




