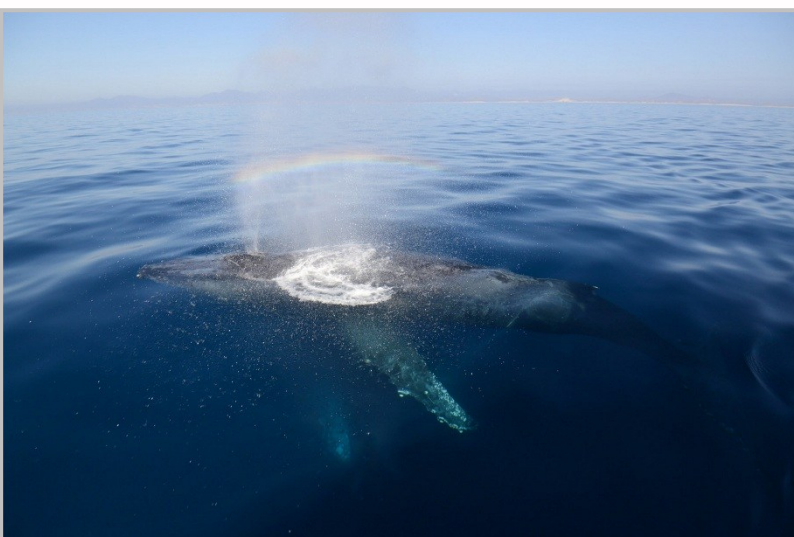
I bought my first proper camera in 1984 when my first son was born. It was a Minolta X700 film camera, fully manual and with the help of books I taught myself how to use it. I took thousands of photos over the next 20 years of the family, pets and holidays.

In 2004 I bought an early digital camera, a Nikon D70, and stumbled my way through that format, eventually joining a camera club in Romsey about 12 or 13 years ago. I had started to be more creative with my shots but didn't enter anything into competitions at the camera club for the first 2 years. I eventually plucked up courage having started to do a lot of wildlife images. I was also experimenting with movement images using slower shutter speed, ICM and in-camera multiple exposure. I have used a Nikon D850 in more recent years. so full frame format.



I'm retired now, but when I was working had the opportunity to do some amazing wildlife trips, which I can highly recommend. Overwintering snow geese (thousands of them) and sand hill cranes in Bosque-del-Apache in New Mexico are stunning. Seeing 30,000 snow geese take off together is a sight (and sound) to behold.

I've done Mark Carwardines Whale Trip a number of times. 11 days at sea starting in San Diego and ending up 1000 miles away at the Sea of Cortez is life changing. Too much to list but you see blue whales (lots in the Pacific), humpbacks, thousands of dolphins in enormous pods and an elephant seal colony on an uninhabited island. The high light are the gray whales in San Ignacio Lagoon. They swim to the warm waters here on the Mexican Coast from the Arctic to give birth. It is a remote Marine Reserve strictly regulated on numbers of people allowed in. Mark's trip spends 2 or 3 days there where you go out in small 8 seater pangas. The whales here are known as "friendlies" and basically the mother gray whale is there for months, not feeding herself, but nourishing her calf ready for the journey back up north. They approach the small boats, often swim under them and often raise their calf out of the water to show it off. Google "grey whales in San Ignacio Lagoon". The lagoon is like an inland sea and the whales choose to approach. It is an amazing experience.



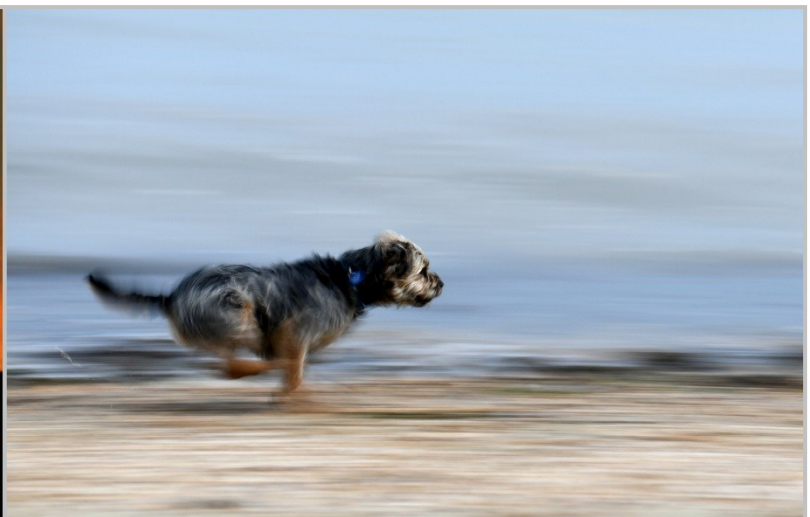


Other favourites are Yellowstone in winter, and bears and wolves in Northern Finland. You see all the wildlife other than bears (as they hibernate) in a Yellowstone winter. Entry to the interior is with a variety of American Companies based in West Yellowstone. We entered on a 1956 snow coach with caterpillar tracks. We hope to do this trip again under our own steam. Yellowstone is very empty in the winter.



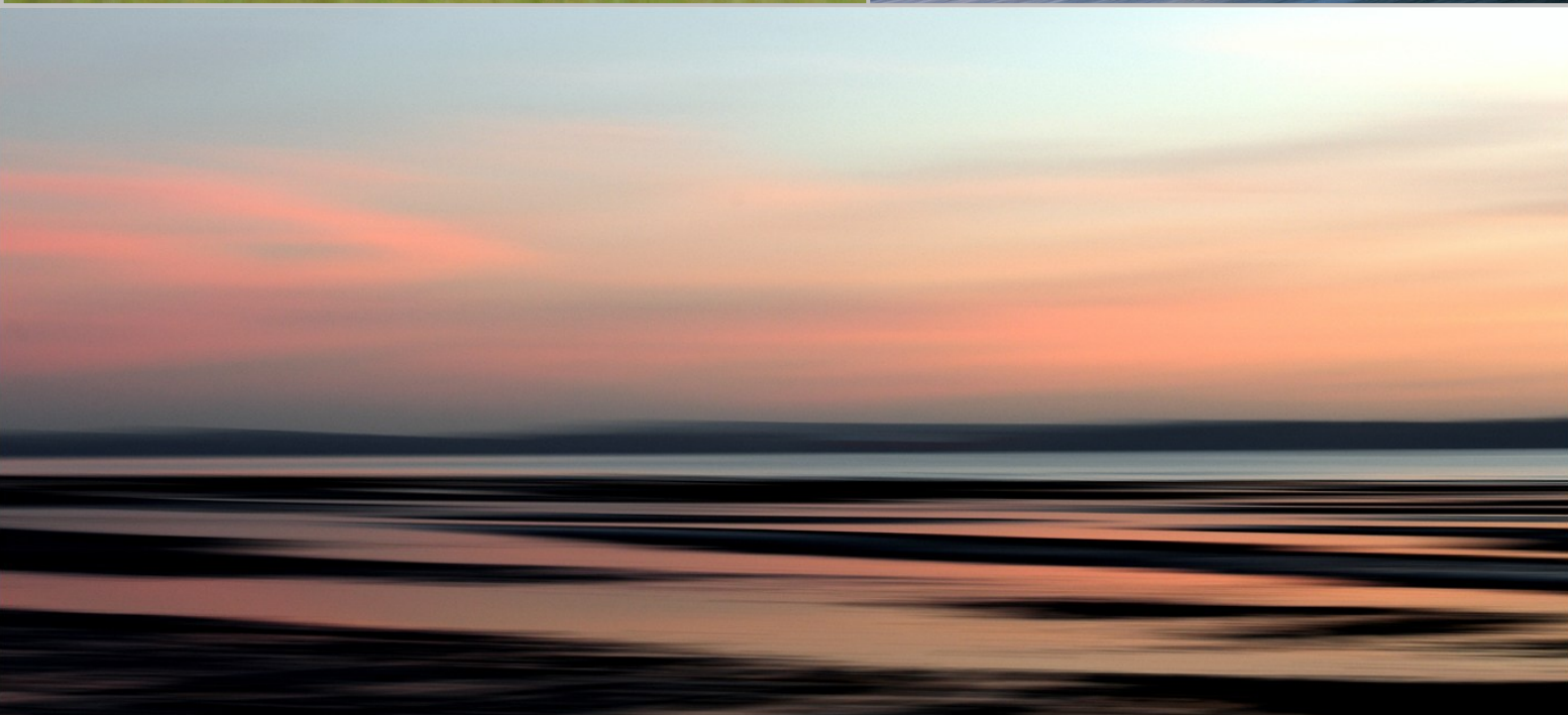
I enjoy photographing birds or red squirrels in this country just as much as abroad. We have a fox family living in our not very big garden. This years cubs have dispersed now but the vixen still appears every night. We love to visit Bempton to see the gannets and managed to get on the Diving Gannet trip with Steve Race eventually. This trip is often cancelled if the weather is not favourable. It took 6 attempts for us to be successful!! All my wildlife images have been trial and error mainly error, but I really enjoy the moment.

I do less photography now than in recent years due to an arm injury and I hurt my neck photographing bee orchids, and it's never been the same!! That put me off for about a year, during which time I did a lot more photography with my Samsung Galaxy and even did a course in London with Jeanette Landon of Jet black Squares. Can highly recommend. I'm getting back into camera photography now and am enjoying being part of a new club. My motivation is hobby photography only, to take images to please myself. I don't enjoy the computer at all, so do the bare minimum of editing. I only use a very old version of Picasa and PS Elements which I dip into. I have an Instagram page, but that is mainly for our border terrier although I do post other stuff too.

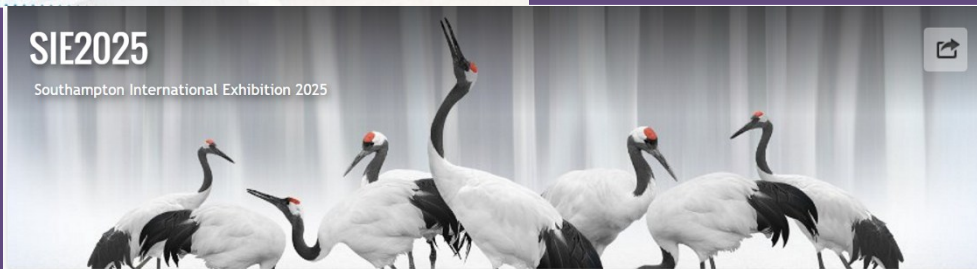
